Midget Races at Clark Township

Clark Township Speedway. located just outside of Westfield, will open Tuesday night with a card of midget auto races. The newly built track will be the mecca of auto pilots of New Jersey on the opening night and a large field is expected to take part in the program.

Cars entered in the races must have less than 100 cubic inches piston displacemnet, 70-inch wheelbase

and 40-inch tread.

Mayor Schultz of Westfield will cut the tape for the first race at the opening on Tuesday night. Commissioners Lang and Knoll of Westfield will also take part in the opening program.

Midget auto racing, a popular

sport on the West Coast and one that is rapidly gaining attention in the East, will come to this section tonight when a program of small-

car events is staged at the new Clark Township Speedway near

The races will be conducted by the National Midget Auto Racing Association and starting tonight will be held every Friday evening until the weather prohibits further meets. The track, newly constructed, is a one-fifth of a mile

affair. Opening of the races has

been held up several weeks pending

completion of the track.

Sam Little, local sportsman, is in charge of the track while Al Stewart of Morristown will start the races. Joseph Meaney of this city will announce the events.

The Midget events have been attracting record crowds in the East since brought here and many leading drivers have abandoned the big cars to compete. Such well known drivers as Bozo Balus, Chuck Tabor, Harry Dunne, Henry Guerand and others are scheduled to drive

The cars despite their size ofttimes reach a speed of 60 to 70 miles an hour and a great deal of close competition usually results. The spills and skids of the big cars are echoes by the little affairs although fortunately accidents are

in tonight's events.

Ten events are scheduled tonight with the races scheduled for an 8:30 p. m. start. The track can be reached by taking Terrill Road to the abandoned schoolhouse and continuing straight ahead instead of turning right to Rahway.

Sam Little, local auto racing promoter, is dickering to take over one of the most famous racing ovals in this section. Little probably will also govern the activities at the Clark Township midget track although no definite announcements are ready as yet for that spot. 3/6/1935

Holmes, Balus, Other Stars Will Drive at Clark Township Oval

Midget-car auto racing will make its debut in this section tomorrow afternoon when a 10-event program is staged at the Clark Township Speedway between Westfield and Rahway. The track is a new fifth of a mile affair especially suited to the small cars and is under the management of Sam Little of this city.

Stewart to Start

The program is slated to get under way at 2 o'clock with at least 20 cars competing in the 10 events which will include qualifying heats and the feature race in addition to special match and handicap events. Al Stewart of Morristown will serve as starter with other Three-A officials are aiding in conducting the program.

One of the leading drivers to appear is Wild Bill Holmes of New York. Holmes won the majority of the feature events at the New York Coliseum during the winter and also scored in mid-Western meets. He will drive the speedy Hauptner Special which carried him to victory time and again during the indoor season.

Another leading contender will be Bob Balus, veteran of all types of auto racing and well known to former patrons of the New Market Speedway. Bozo gained some attention here two years back with his leaps from the rear of the speeding race car. Since the advent of the small cars Balus has come to the fore rapidly and is rated as one of Holmes' greatest rivals for the kingfish title. His customary devilmay-care attitude has stood him in good stead in the little cars.

Mike Lowack, Chuck Tabor, Kingsley Woodsworth, George Villa, Herman Venth and others of like caliber are also scheduled to compete and it is expected that several big-car race pilots will be on hand with no AAA race meets scheduled tomorrow in the East.

A number of out-of-state cars are also expected with Manager Little today receiving a wire from George Tuttle of Bridgeport, Conn., that he would be on hand with a fast car. Others probably will come from that location as well.

Despite their size, the midgets reach fair speeds and the sport is as dangerous as the big-car events with the usual slides, skids, etc., providing thrills. Many of the greatest drivers of the country found their skill tested with the midgets during the winter.

The Clark Township Speedway can be reached from Plainfield via Terrill Road and from Westfield by Central Avenue, turning right into Raritan Road.

Midget auto racing will be continued tonight, weather permitting, at the Clark Township Speedway, near Westfield with a program of approximately 10 races. Two of the last three programs at the nearby track have been washed out but promoters and drivers are hoping for a better break tonight.

The races will get under way in the vicinity of 7:45 o'clock with the time trials with qualifying heats for the feature event and special races being staged along with the

25-lap main contest.

Art Dick of West New York and Larry Ball of St. George, S. I. winners of a recent main events at the Clark Township fitch-mile track, will head the field while others to be seen in action are Quinty Villa of Westfield, Firman Lawshe of Flemington, Frank Maple of Bound Brook, Ken Stowe of Morristown, Charlie Goggi of Staten Island Edgar Reid of New Brunswick and others.

Frankie Bailey, youthful New Brunswick speedster, has notified the promoters that he will be on hand again tonight and probably will have a new car. In his only appearance at the track some weeks back, Bailey turned in a brilliant performance and is looked upon as a real threat for tonight's feature.
