

The track has become affiliated with NASCAR, the largest association of stock car racing in the country. Some of the best NASCAR drivers in the country are expected to compete at New Egypt this year.

New Egypt Speed Card Set Sunday

New Egypt Speedway's third stock car program of the season is set for Sunday night, starting at 8 o'clock. Joe Bossard, the flying sallor from Little Falls, N. J. will try to repeat his feature race win of last Sunday night. As usual, Bossard and other North Jersey speedsters will face keen competition from New Egypt drivers.

The Ocean County contingent includes the Moschera brothers, Augle and Jim; Frank Myroncuk and "Stubby" Stevens. Augle Moschera finished second to Bossard in last week's main event.

New Egypt Speedway is operating under the NASCAR banner this year for the first time. Stock car fans evidently favor the tieup with Prasident Bill France's National Association of Stock Car Auto Racers. Attendance has been good at both programs to date.

Bossard scored a "double" last weekend, winning at Roosevelt Stadium, Jersey City, the night before his New Egypt triumph. The Jersey City feature race was featured by a near fist fight between Mikh Rubino and Walt Tompkins. Rubino's car crashed into the fence and was followed by a four-car pileup. Rubino accused Tompkins of "fencing" him and the pair started awinging fists. Officials soon separated them and restarted the race. Rubino is expected to be among the 25 or 30 New Egypt entries Sunday night.

Track Manager Anthony Flach will make a special trip to Jersey City tomorrow night to double check the North Jersey entries on Sunday's night's New Egypt Card. Frank Coman and Jack Bellinotta are among the well-regarded North Jerseyans who have indicated that they will try to prevent Bossard from monopolizing the winner's circle.

NEW EGYPT—Fans from New Egypt and surrounding area have plenty of cause for cheer every Sunday night at the quarter-of-a-mile New Egypt Speedway. A half-dozen or more home town drivers are more than holding their own against the best NASCAR stock car pilots from the rest of New Jersey.

New Egypt Speedway will offer its 11th speed program of the season tonight, starting at 8 o'clock, In the thick of the competition on the macadam-topped oval will be the Moschera brothers, Augie and Jim; Frank Myroncuk, Howard (Stubby) Stevens, Ike Cottrell and Horace Smith, all of New Egypt, and Otha Johnson of nearby Hornerstown.

Keen Point Races

Until a week or so ago the two Moschera boys were topping the NASCAR point races—Jim in the sportsman division and Augie among the drivers of modified stock cars. Frank Coman of Pequannock, N. J., now has edged ahead of Jim Moschera in the sportsman group. And Stevens is engaging Augie in an all-New Egypt battle for modified car laurels.

Myroncuk, president of the New Egypt Stock Car Drivers Association, has been plagued with poor racing luck recently at his home track. Accidents and motor trouble have prevented Frank from keeping pace with the other point seekers. However, Myroncuk won two features early in the season and is second on the point list at Wall Stadium, Belmar.

New Egypt's last two features have been won by Dave Harris, Point Pleasant, and Don Allison, Philadelphia,

Tonight's card will consist of the usual three qualifying heats, two semi-finals, a consolation event and the 25-lap feature race.

Second Win For Bossart At New Egypt

NEW EGYPT — Joe Bossart, the speeding sailor from Little Falls, N. J., scored his second straight New Egypt Speedway feature race win last night. Bossart negotiated the 25 laps around the quarter-mile racing strip in 7:01.21 for a new track record for this season. Bossart clipped almost seven seconds off his winning 7:08 time of the previous week.

Lenny Gould, Newark, manipulated his stock car to second place in last night's feature. Jimmy Moschera of New Egypt was third.

A spectacular crash occurred during the first lap of the feature. A car driven by Harry Simons turned over twive but the driver escaped injury. The race was restarted.
